

## County Councillors Report June/July 2019.

### Adult Social Care.

Overall savings are being made in the Adult Social Care Budget as a result of the Adult Single Programme of demand management. Savings of £10.5m are being generated by the new approach to care by March 2020 we hope to have made savings of well over £20m. Tight management of individual care packages ensure that all service users receive everything they need to support but no more. This is done with the close co-operation of the NHS at all stages.

Gloucestershire's Integrated Care System allows greater flexibility and the creation of a single health and care system for Gloucestershire that will create best value and care for all citizens.

New service providers to assist family and friends in the provision of services to vulnerable people include work with homeless people for the most vulnerable in our community.

A new Adult Social Care and Community Scrutiny panel has been formed to ensure that forward looking best value programmes are employed providing benefits to the Community.

### Economy, Education and Skills.

The Broadband Gloucestershire Project is in its final stages and a plan has been prepared that will ensure that the remaining parts of the county that are not yet supplied with broadband will be fully broadband enabled.

New schools are being developed in Cheltenham, Stonehouse and Chesterton to accommodate large increases in population due to new housing provision.

### Environment and Planning.

The Highways Development Team have been reorganised to provide better service for new development consultation responses to Local Planning Authority Planning Applications.

A new climate change strategy is being prepared to manage the effects of climate change and this will be delivered in Autumn 2019.
